BONSAI SESSIONS PLANNED

Due to the cancellation of the Bonsai Mum course at the National Arboretum, ODCS members who would like assistance in training their bonsai mums are welcome to attend bonsai mum sessions that we are organizing for this summer. Jack Rubenstein, who is a bonsai enthusiast, will guide the training. The focus of the sessions is for participants to learn wiring techniques to train their own plants.

The sessions will be conducted in Tim Moore's back yard at 9338 Athens Road, Fairfax, VA. Participants should bring their plants, their own designs, as well as bonsai wires (which can be obtained from the Stone Lantern website in 1mm, 1.5 mm and 2 mm sizes) and tools, and are encouraged to enter their creations at the ODCS Annual Chrysanthemum Show in October. The prospective dates for the sessions are June 8, July 12, August 9, and September 7. TESTING A NEW CULTIVAR

John Capobianco, President of the Long Island Chrysanthemum Society, has made a proposal to other chapters of the National Chrysanthemum Society, including the ODCS, concerning testing out a new cultivar descended from the old "Artist Pink." This plant was carried in the Kings mums catalog many years ago but has since lapsed.

John has been has been collecting seedsfrom mums pollinated by bees in the hopes that a lookalike cultivar would pop up. He has germinated 300 seeds. What he is looking for is help in growing the seedlings and testing them for the results. He is willing to give the seedlings away to anyone that pays the postage and shipping costs. What he asks in return is that they record data on a chart he will provide. They would then be able to enter the seedlings under the new K2 section of an NCS sanctioned show.
